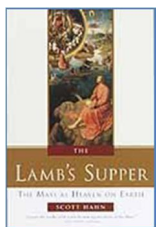

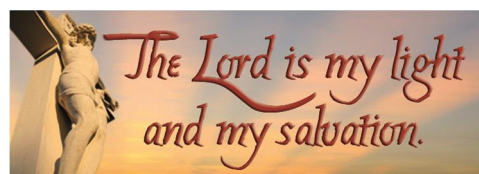

Scripture Reflection

Saint Paul's message to the church in Corinth is a difficult one to live. He tells these early Christians, as well as each of us, do not be divided. As Christians it is our duty to work toward the common good and bring the Gospel message to everyone we meet. We are one people believing in One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church – regardless of the language we speak.

In the reading from Isaiah we hear that the lands that had been degraded are now producing harvests, and the people have been delivered from darkness into the light. As Christians we have been delivered into the light of Christ to live with joy and peace.

Jesus calls His first disciples in the Gospel reading. While they were busy at work, Jesus calls them and asks them to follow Him. He asks them to change professions, to learn new skills, to change the way they look at the world. Jesus asks them to be the ultimate stewards of their gifts, giving all they have, and all they are, in service to the Lord.

We are asked to give of ourselves as we spread the Gospel message, to use our God given talents and skills to better the world, our neighborhood, our church, and most importantly our self. The Lord's request is pretty simple, to love one another and to spread His light to the world. Are we living up to our baptismal commitments, are we living the Gospel every day, or are we hoping to make up for everything during our final days? Live everyday as if it was your last, and you can be assured of a place in the Kingdom.

Reflexiones de Escrituras

El mensaje de San Pablo a la iglesia de Corintios es uno difícil para vivir. Él les dice a estos primeros Cristianos, igual como a nosotros, que no nos dividamos. Como cristianos es nuestro deber de trabajar para un bien común y traer el mensaje del Evangelio a todos con los que conozcamos. Somos un solo pueblo creyente en la Iglesia que es Una, Santa, Católica y Apostólica – sin importar el lenguaje que hablemos.

En la lectura de Isaías escuchamos que las tierras que habían sido dañadas ahora producen cosecha, y que las personas habían sido sacadas de la oscuridad y puestas en la luz. Como cristianos hemos sido entregados en la luz de Cristo para vivir una vida de paz y alegría.

Jesús llama a Sus primeros discípulos en la lectura del Evangelio. Mientras estaban ocupados en su trabajo, Jesús los llama y les dice que lo sigan. Él les pide que cambien de profesión, que aprendan una nueva habilidad, que cambien la forma de ver el mundo. Jesús les pide que sean los mejores administradores de sus bienes, dando todo lo que tienen, y todo lo que son, en servicio al Señor.

Se nos pide que demos de nosotros al difundir el mensaje del Evangelio, que utilicemos los talentos y habilidades que Dios nos ha dado para mejorar el mundo, nuestro barrio, nuestra iglesia, pero lo más importante a nosotros mismos. Lo que el Señor nos pide es verdaderamente sencillo, que nos amemos los unos a los otros y que difundamos Su luz al mundo. ¿Estamos viviendo al nivel de nuestros compromisos bautismales? ¿Estamos viviendo el Evangelio todos los días, o estamos esperando compensar todo durante nuestros últimos días de vida? Vivan todos los días como su fuera el ultimo, y así se aseguran un lugar en el Reino de Dios.
